

POINTS OF PRIDE

- ▶ The CSE School of Graduate and Continuing Studies started its 2007-08 academic year with record-breaking enrollment. The School welcomed approximately 500 adult students, including students enrolled in the CSE new doctoral program in Educational Leadership, and two master programs – M.S. in Nursing and a M.A. in Forensic Psychology and Counseling; the Women's College received nearly 200 first-time students.
- ▶ In September 2007, the College held its inaugural Open House and Dedication Ceremony for its arts education building, Annunciation Center. The celebratory event featured student musicians and artists practicing their art; music by the Gary Ross Jazz Trio; a cornerstone and building blessing lead by Bishop Arthur J. Serratelli of Paterson; prayer service, and ribbon cutting ceremonies.
- ▶ The College of Saint Elizabeth's Athletic Department has been accepted, as an institution, into the Eastern College Athletic Conference, the largest athletic conference in the United States.
- ▶ In Spring 2008, CSE began to offer a new Bachelor of Arts degree in Computer Information Systems. The new program offers a balance between computing technology and the business world, with strong emphasis on the effective use of computers and information technology to solve problems in business.
- ▶ In the Spring 2008, County College of Morris (CCM) students began to take full advantage of the new joint business degree program offered between CSE and CCM. The program allows students to transfer up to 96 credits from CCM to CSE, and complete a bachelor's degree at CSE through flexible evening, weekend and on-line programs.

- ▶ New York, Philadelphia, Washington, the Jersey Shore, and the neighboring towns of Morristown and Madison are within easy reach by train at the College's front gate

- ▶ Founded in 1899 by the Sisters of Charity; incorporated in 1900
- ▶ The oldest college for women in New Jersey and one of the first Catholic colleges in the United States to award degrees to women
- ▶ Accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education since 1921
- ▶ Vibrant coeducational adult degree programs since 1976
- ▶ Offering resources to foster lay leadership in the Church through the Center for Theological and Spiritual Development since 1982
- ▶ Master's degrees offered since 1994
- ▶ Consolidation of the School of Graduate and Continuing Studies in 2001
- ▶ Completion of \$25 million Centennial Campaign in 2002 and \$13.5 million Annunciation Center Campaign in 2007
- ▶ Opening of Annunciation Center, new arts and education multi-purpose facility in August 2007
- ▶ Debut of the College's first new Doctoral Program in Educational Leadership Fall 2007
